



ZACH MERCURIO

Zach Mercurio, Ph. D., is a researcher, leadership development facilitator, and speaker who specializes in purposeful leadership, mattering at work, meaningful work, and positive organizational psychology. He's the author of *The Power of Mattering: How Leaders Can Create a Culture of Significance* (Harvard Business Review Press, 2025) and *The Invisible Leader: Transform Your Life, Work, and Organization with the Power of Authentic Purpose*.

Zach advises leaders in organizations worldwide on practices for building cultures that promote well-being, motivation, and performance. Some of his clients include the U.S. Army, USA Wrestling, Delta Airlines, Marriott International, The Government of Canada, and The National Park Service. He also serves as one of author Simon Sinek's "Optimist Instructors."

Zach holds a Ph.D. in organizational learning, performance, and change from Colorado State University, where he serves as a senior fellow in the Center for Meaning and Purpose and as an Instructor in the Organizational Learning, Performance, and Change program. His research on meaningful work has been recognized by the Association for Talent Development, the Academy of Management, and the Academy of Human Resource Development. Zach's thinking on leadership and meaningful work has been featured in *The Harvard Business Review*, *Forbes*, *Psychology Today*, *ABCNews*, *The Denver Post*, and *Thrive Global*. He lives in Fort Collins, CO, with his wife, two sons, and two adopted dogs.

Cameron W. Piercy (PhD, University of Oklahoma) is an Associate Professor of Relationships and Digital Media. He is the founding director of the Human-Machine Communication Lab. He researches dynamic socio-technical networks facilitated by new media, especially in organizational contexts. His dissertation, “Strength of weak ties and the modern job search,” won the NCA Human Communication Technology Division outstanding dissertation award. His research is published in communication, technology, organization science, and psychology journals including: Communication Research, New Media & Society, Computers in Human Behavior, International Journal of Business Communication, and Mobile Media & Communication.

Dr. Piercy teaches undergraduate and graduate classes focused on teams and groups, human-machine communication, computer-mediated communication, organizational communication, and social network analysis.


