CURRENT EVENTS IN HIGHER EDUCATION

EDUCATORS WORRY DECREASE IN FAFSA APPLICATIONS MEANS FEWER LOWER-INCOME STUDENTS CONSIDERING COLLEGE

The Philadelphia Inquirer (2/28, Snyder, Graham) reports that high school and college counselors and financial-aid officials are worried "that fewer students from lower-income families may pursue college this fall." FAFSA "is the form that state and federal agencies and colleges use to determine students' eligibility for financial aid." In a regular year, 18 million to 19 million students "use it, both rising seniors and students already in college, with deadlines that vary from state to state." Nationwide, FAFSA applications "from first-time filers are down by 140,000 – or more than 9% – than at the same point last year." It's an improvement "from November, when the gap was 17%, but still cause for concern, said MorraLee Keller, director of technical assistance for the National College Attainment Network." Filing a FAFSA is "one of the highest predictors of whether students will enroll, she said."



SENATE CONFIRMS CARDONA AS EDUCATION SECRETARY ON 64-33 VOTE

The Washington Post (3/1, Meckler, Douglas-Gabriel) reports the Senate in a 64-33 vote "confirmed Miguel Cardona to serve as education secretary Monday, vaulting the littleknown Connecticut educator into the center of the national debate over how to reopen schools for face-to-face classes." The Post adds that the bipartisan vote came after Cardona's nomination "moved through the chamber without any significant controversy – in contrast with the confirmation his immediate predecessor, Betsy DeVos, who needed the tiebreaking vote of Vice President Mike Pence to win confirmation."
