### SCHOLARSHIPS OFFERED FOR MEMBERS TO ATTEND CONFERENCE

Whether you're still working from home or finally back in the office, one thing we can all look forward to this fall is the 2021 Annual Conference in Colby! To celebrate, KACRAO is offering two scholarships for members to attend in-person.

"It has been a difficult year for most with COVID and changes to institutional budgets. As an organization, we know the value of the annual conference to each of us as professionals. Because of that, Executive Council voted to offer two scholarships to the conference this year which will cover the conference registration as well as the 2-night hotel stay. Scholarship winners are only responsible for their travel to the conference and food outside of what is provided during the conference." explained Maggie Harris, Program Committee Chair.

Harris also encourages members to attend the conference and get the opportunity to reconnect with their fellow admissions and registrars officers after a long year of virtual conferences, meetings, and college fairs!

"The annual conference provides a lot of value to us as professionals. The knowledge we gain from sessions presented as well as the connections we are able to make with other professionals across the state makes such an impact on what we do. We work together to brainstorm new ideas and discuss best practices as professionals. So many of us face the same challenges and this allows us talk through them and take what we learn back to our home institutions. Whether members have been to a conference before or this will be their first one, we don't want the cost to attend to be the reason someone isn't able to come."

Aside from getting the opportunity to attend the conference, scholarship recipients are also required to participate in a KACRAO committee for the 2021–2022 year. Harris explains why this requirement is so important for scholarship recipients to experience.

### CÜRRENT EVENTS IN HIGHER EDUCATION

RECENT SURVEY SHOWS HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS CHANGE OF COLLEGE PLANS DUE TO PANDEMIC



Inside Higher Education (6/28, Jaschik, Scott) reports that a survey done by the America's Promise Alliance shows that "Approximately four out of five (78 percent) 11th and 12th graders reported that COVID-19 has impacted their plans after high school at least a little bit, with almost one in five reporting their plans were impacted a great deal." The survey, which was conducted in March and April 2021, showed that "most commonly, students reported changes to where they plan to attend college. For example, one-third (34 percent) of young people report changing their plans to attend college closer to home and one-quarter (24 percent) plan to attend a two-year instead of a four-year institution." As a new academic year approaches, institutions will need to focus on how they can adjust to these changes as the effects of the pandemic continue to make an impact on students postsecondary education choices.

### KANSAS PROMISE ACT HELPS ELIGIBLE STUDENTS PAY FOR COLLEGE



The Kansas Promise Scholarship is a \$10 million program that was passed by the Kansas Legislature and signed by Governor Laura Kelly in April of 2021. According to the Kansas Board of Regents, the Kansas promise Act Scholarship was created "to assist students attending Kansas community colleges, technical colleges, Washburn Institute of Technology and certain private postsecondary educational institutions and enrolled in specified programs of student." Over thirty Kansas institutions will be offering this unique scholarship in the fall for eligible students studying "specified programs of study". The scholarship "may be used toward tuition, required fees, books, and required program materials" that are not already covered by other scholarships and grants. Students who sign the scholarship will have to "live and work in the State of Kansas for two consecutive years following the successful completion of their program of study."
