





# **CAN YOU NAME THAT CAMPUS?**



# A. Shiftepace - Wichita State University

Wichita State University's campus offers a wide variety of Fine Arts Degrees, both in Performing Arts and Studio Arts. One unique experience that we offer is our student-run Art Gallery, located in downtown Wichita! Shiftspace offers students an opportunity to gain direct experience in the art scene, as well as connecting our campus to the local community through the art sphere."



#### B. <u>Alvin the Alligator-</u> Southwestern College

The campus' unofficial mascot for four decades became with Southwestern College in 1959 when members of the Pi Epsilon Pi fraternity brought a pair of sixinch alligators back from vacation. long Before an SC professor became the keeper of Pi and Ep (names of the original pair.) When Pi ate Ep, the survivor was renamed "Alvin" and soon became a highlight of campus tours. Alvin the Alligator died on January 13, 2000, and an autopsy reveals that he is really a she. Alvin was preserved by a taxidermist and is on permanent display in "his" home in Mossman Hall.



#### C. <u>Power Plant Technology-Flint</u> <u>Hills Technical College</u>

Power Plant Technology at Flint Hills Technical College is an exclusive major in the state of Kansas.

Being one of the only power plant training programs in Kansas, Power Plant Technology provides students with an understanding of five types of power plants; coal, nuclear gas, hydroelectric, and solar power. Skills from classroom, laboratory and internship experiences will give Power Plant Technology majors the skills to operate, install, service and repair power plant equipment. FHTC's 2022 Job Placement Report indicates that the average annual salary for Power Plant Technology is over \$50,000.



## D. <u>STAC Partnership - Salina Area</u> <u>Technical College</u>

Salina Tech began a partnership with the Kansas Army National Guard in 2018. The partnership is titled Synchronous Training for Academic (STAC). Through Reserve, partnership, Active Duty, and National Guard soldiers who take Military Occupational Specialty courses for maintenance at the Kansas Army National Guard training site are eligible to simultaneously college credit for their training in welding, military machining, heating/ventilation/air conditioning (HVAC). Soldiers attend a 6-week training at the Kansas Regional Training Institute just down the street from Salina Tech. Then, Salina Tech faculty grade students' final projects. Through the STAC partnership, soldiers an AAS dearee complete Technical Studies.

To date, 51 individuals have earned college credit through this partnership, 9 students have earned an AAS degree, and 4 more candidates are eligible to graduate in May 2023!
