Kansas, Betsy DeVos views

Kansas education officials concerned about U.S. Department of Education appointment

Kansas officials representing state and local school organizations are worried about stances Betsy DeVos, appointed U.S. Secretary of Education Feb. 7, has on public education. DeVos has been a longtime advocate of school choice and vouchers, which compete with the very institution she now represents – U.S. public education. Below is a summary of comments reported in a Topeka Capital-Journal article published Jan. 10.

“She has no regard for public education,” said Ann Mah, D-Topeka, the newest member of the Kansas State Board of Education. “I can’t see her doing anything good for public education, and I’d be quite concerned about huge block grants going to states based on their willingness to do what I would consider bad things for kids.”

Kansas Education Commissioner Randy Watson says districts in rural areas of Kansas can’t offer school choice but more flexibility needs to be offered within the traditional, public school setting, especially at the high school level. “We need more kids to have post-secondary education,” Watson says, suggesting the diverse post-secondary options students can obtain in Kansas.

Suzan Patton, superintendent of Pratt USD 382, is also concerned about DeVos promoting school vouchers and charter schools. “We think it’s best for kids to explore options for getting an education, whether that’s school-within-a-school, or virtual school,” Patton says, suggesting options within the public school system.

Uncertainty looms for int’l students, U.S. immigration policy

Immediate immigration policy actions by U.S. President Donald Trump coupled with an apparent hate crime shooting of an Indian international student have raised concerns of international enrollment at colleges across the U.S. International students and their families, accounting for about one million people, have begun weighing other options to enrolling at U.S. schools. Deciding to stay home or to attend schools in other countries such as Canada and Australia could have a major impact on U.S. enrollment numbers, the American economy, and inclusivity of thought that drives innovation.

Evaluating Early FAFSA

Created with low-income students in mind, the early Free Application for Federal Student Aid, or FAFSA, sought to give students more financial information earlier to aid in their decision-making process. Two early indicators have shown ineffectiveness in pursuit of this goal. Statistics on early FAFSA applications show that the students who applied to the early FAFSA application were just the opposite: high income (non-Pell), dependents, whose parents attended college. Further, only 57% of the schools polled by the National Association of Student Financial Aid Administrators said they would communicate financial aid packages early – 30 percent of which only a few weeks earlier in contrast to the 3-month change in FAFSA application date. With these indicators in mind, this article offers some points to consider when evaluating the effectiveness of early FAFSA in its inaugural year.

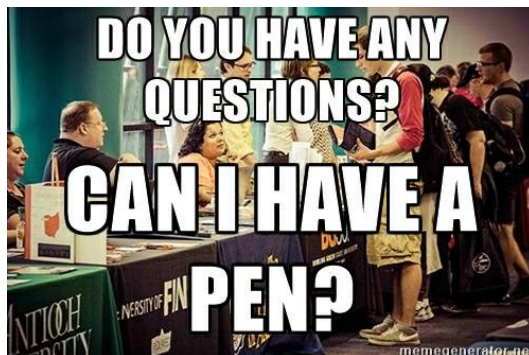
AACRAO offers a variety of FERPA training and consulting, compliance audits and vendor product reviews and a library of publications for its members.
