

Did you know that one of the first KACRAO Annual Conferences happened in 1960? This conference was hosted by the University of Wichita now known as Wichita State University. The president at the time was Thelma Book who represented Wesleyan University! Since then, conferences have been hosted by the following institutions: Kansas Wesleyan University, University of Kansas, McPherson College, Kansas State College of Pittsburg now Pittsburg State University, Emporia State University, Sterling College, Southwestern College, Washburn University, Hutchinson Junior College now Hutchinson Community College, Fort Hays State University, Sacred Heart College, Bethel College, Emporia State University, Johnson County Community College, Kansas State University, Kansas City Kansas Community College, Dodge City Community College, Washburn University, KCTI, Garden City Community College, Barton County Community College, Butler County Community College, and Colby Community College.

In 2015, KACRAO had eight amazing colleges host the conference together. This included Bethany College, Bethel College, Hesston College, Central Christian College of Kansas, Kansas Wesleyan University, McPherson College, Sterling College, and Tabor College. In 2020, we didn't let Covid stop us from bringing our wonderful KACRAO members together. The conference held its head up high and had a Fall Virtual Series conference.
