## Flanders sets Foresight 2020

### *Higher education's role in the future of Kansas*

Increased educational attainment is a necessary goal for the prosperity of our Kansas economy and we play a critical part in the success of the Kansas economy. Without an increase in postsecondary graduates, Kansas could face “decreases in personal income per capita, lost income and sales tax revenues to the state, declining federal revenues and lost savings in both Medicaid and corrections budgets,” says Blake Flanders, president of the Kansas Board of Regents. As such, the importance of higher education is clear – more educational opportunity brings about a brighter Kansas economy. Flanders notes that since the 2010 establishment of a 10-year strategic agenda, Kansas has made great strides, especially in engineering and technical training. Engineering graduates have increased statewide by over 300 graduates each year since 2011 and high school students enrolled in technical programs has increased from 6,000 students to 10,000 students in four years.

## *KJCCC eliminates out-of-state student athletic roster limits*

The Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference (KJCCC) made an historic move this fall by eliminating limits on the number out-of-state athletic scholarships Kansas community colleges can give. This move may create competition between Kansas-based students and out-of-state students (and international students, for that matter) vying for junior college athletic play.

Also, starting in 2018-2019, the KJCCC will allow Kansas community colleges to grant full-ride scholarships in National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) Division I sports.

## Keep your eyes on traffic, road warrior

This Fall the Kansas Insurance Department, the Kansas Department of Transportation, the Kansas Turnpike Authority, AT&T, and several insurance companies partnered to encourage drivers to commit to stop texting while driving.

Texting while driving endangers you and others around you. When a driver takes eyes off the road the chances of an accident is dramatically increased. It only takes an average of 3 seconds for any road collision to occur. This is the same time it takes to start your vehicle—not long at all.

The initiative created a friendly competition to encourage participation across the state, allowing participants to show school pride in their favorite school when they signed the pledge between Oct. 13 and Nov. 22. Emporia State University received the highest number of votes by percentage of students and won the “Don’t Text #JustDrive” contest with 63.7% student population participation. There were some unique statistics for each school during the pledge. For example, Kansas State University had the most pledges; University of Kansas’ support was

most widespread; Pittsburg State University had the best “drive for change” results by promoting downloads to block text messages while driving and Wichita State University’s student government promoted the campaign. Fort Hays State University had the most text pledges, and Washburn University saw the biggest increase in one week. Overall we all win through this campaign; Kansas is a safer place to drive. Now it’s up to everyone to stick to their commitment!

As admissions representatives, we are road warriors who spend hours at a time in the car. According to national statistics 3 out of 4 people admit to texting while driving. I think we can all agree this is dangerous and a text message is not worth a life. Though the campaign competition has ended, I would like to encourage all KACRAO members to take this time to make a personal commitment to “Don’t Text #Just Drive!” as the campaign slogan says: “Eyes up, phone off, save lives.” □

## HS students ‘Apply Kansas’

Apply Kansas had another great fall helping Kansas students pursue a postsecondary education by applying to college! A total of 27 high schools participated in the initiative, an increase of 84% over 2015’s pilot program. Governor Brownback also issued a proclamation declaring October 2016 as Apply Kansas: College Application Month.

This fall each school that hosted a college application event received a banner to display, as well as “I Applied” stickers for each student. Schools are still reporting statistics from their events and final numbers should be published in early 2017.
